SHOWMANSHIP

Rules

- A. **Exhibitor must show his/her own animal.**
- B. Independent Juniors and Grange members should enter under their appropriate 4-H age group.
- C. All exhibitors are required to wear the official show uniform. For more information on show dress, please refer to the INSTRUCTIONS TO EXHIBITORS at the beginning of the youth livestock department. Independent juniors must wear white pants and shirt.
- D. Animals used in showmanship must be shown in individual classes.
- E. **ANIMALS MAY NOT BE BROUGHT ON GROUNDS SPECIFICALLY FOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES.**
- F. Exhibitor's age on all showmanship classes is as of January 1st.
- G. Any contestants winning first or second in a showmanship class that makes them eligible for Round Robin must notify the Livestock Office if they will be unable to compete in Round Robin.
- H. Contestants who place first and second in their age group will compete in one final class as a group (*where applicable*). The first and second place winners of this class will then participate in Round Robin.
- I. See specific Divisions for judging times.
- J. Animals will arrive and depart according to the division in which they are entered.
- K. *Novice classes: These classes are for those who have never shown that specie of livestock before (as of January 1). 1st & 2nd place winners in this class advance to the run-off round.*
- L. The same animal used in the age class must be used in the run-off.
- M. Pre-entry into showmanship is required. Exhibitors must enter showmanship by close of entries.
- N. Junior Exhibitors with a disability may request reasonable accommodations to be made by notifying the Entry Office in advance.

JUNIOR ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP

1. Open to qualifying Exhibitors (those that placed 1st and 2nd in their age appropriate class or the run-off class). Senior 4-H Round Robin is for 14 years and up and Junior 4-H Round Robin for exhibitors ages 9 - 13. First & second place winners are the only ones eligible to compete.
2. **Judging:**
 - **Large Animal** – Saturday, August 11, 6:00 p.m. – All Showrings
 - **Small Animal** – Saturday, August 11, 10:00 a.m. – Dorfman Ring
3. **The Sonoma County Fair will provide all animals for use in the Round Robin competitions.**
4. Should an exhibitor qualify in more than one specie, (*ex: placing 1st in beef showmanship and same exhibitor placing 2nd in sheep showmanship*) no other exhibitor will be considered to replace him/her to participate in contest.
5. Round Robin Format: Exhibitors participating in Round Robin will follow a group format. Each specie shown will include multiple participants to simulate a real showmanship class.

Division 5301 – Large Animal Round Robin

FFA/4-H/Independent Junior contestants will be required to show each specie of beef cattle (*market & breeding*), dairy cattle, dairy goats, market goats, sheep (*market & breeding*), swine (*market & breeding*), and horse. 1st and 2nd place winners in their showmanship class are the only ones eligible to participate in Round Robin Showmanship. Fair to provide all animals.

Division 5302 – Small Animal Round Robin

Contestants will be required to show each specie of rabbits, poultry, covies, pygmy goats, and dogs. Contestants planning to participate must notify the Fur & Feathers Superintendent following the show. A time of 5 minutes will be allowed for showmanship in each specie. Fair to provide all animals.

Judging

Judges will score each contestant on a point system of 1 - 10, with 1 being low and 10 high. In the event of a tie score between 2 or more exhibitors, the tie will be broken in this order:

- A. The exhibitor with the highest score on the specie that qualified him/her for Round Robin.
- B. The exhibitor with the most consistent set of scores.

Example:	Contestant #1	6	7	10	8	=	31
	Contestant #2	8	7	9	7	=	31

Contestant #2 would be the winner.

- C. Different questions will be used for each contest.

Contest Rules

- A. Exhibitor must be 18 years of age or older, and not a current Sonoma County Fair Junior Exhibitor.
- B. Bulls, rams, or boars will be permitted at the discretion of the junior ambassador committee advisors.
- C. Entrants must be physically able to show and keep the animal under control.
- D. Showmanship and good sportsmanship conduct is expected of all entrants.
- E. Entrants must use animals currently on exhibit at the fair.
- F. No pre-registration is required.
- G. Gift certificates will be awarded at ringside to all winners.

**Employees of the Fair are ineligible to compete in Adult Showmanship.*
